









SWOT Emerging Themes

Priority 1: Behavioral Health, Mental Health, Addictive Disorders

Priority 2: Unemployment & Economic Development

Priority 3: Violence, Crime, & Intentional Injury

SWOT Emerging Themes

Priority 1: Behavioral Health, Mental Health, Addictive Disorders

- S:** Good BH awareness, training, and services in non-traditional and multi-sector areas (e.g., ER , first responders, Coroner's office, primary care)
- W:** Stigma and lack of cultural competency (especially language barriers and working with the homeless), along with a lack of wrap-around and coordinated care services
- O:** Many examples of evidence-based best practices being utilized in care. Increased opportunity for providers to operate through increases in funding (private and Medicaid) and increased recognition of frontline providers (crisis counselors, case managers)
- T:** Limited & decreased funding contributes to lack of human resources and facilities

SWOT Emerging Themes

Priority 2: Unemployment & Economic Development

S: Vibrant & unique culture that feeds strong hospitality and tourism industries

W: Low educational attainment and poor quality public schools, insufficient or inadequate (poor quality) resources (e.g., child care, social services, schools, re-entry for previously incarcerated citizens, mental health, mentoring programs, etc.)

O: Youth (and adult) vocational training programs and employment opportunities (NOLA Youth Works, Job Corp, Urban League), Industry growth and higher education institutions to promote job readiness and new jobs

T: Lack of educational/training opportunities, limited opportunities & many barriers for new business development. Socio-political, economic, and environmental barriers to economic development like poverty, crime, lack of social services, prevalence of natural disasters, lack of federal and state funding, etc.



SWOT Emerging Themes

Priority 3: Violence, Crime, Intentional Injury

- S:** Improved law enforcement policies and practices (e.g., body cameras, community policing, increased police presence, etc.). Both CBO and government programs exist to address violence.
- W:** Lack of quality education, job training and employment opportunities, and lack of education of providers and community in appropriate and effective response
- O:** Enhanced or expanded law enforcement practices (e.g., technologies, community policing, evidence collection), and coordinated/collaborative work among stakeholders (neighborhood associations, FQHCs, schools, policymakers)
- T:** Community distrust of law enforcement, profiling, low numbers of police, low funding to OPP. Many community members are exposed to things that put them at risk of committing or being the victim of crime (racism, lack of health insurance, lack of parental involvement, lack of community involvement (due to fear), lack of self-esteem)

SWOT Emerging Themes: High Level Synopsis

Priority 1: Behavioral Health, Mental Health, Addictive Disorders

There are many examples of evidence-based, successful interventions being implemented in Region 1, but lack of funding is a major impediment.

Questions to Consider.....

How has each parish in Region 1 combatted the issue of diminished funding for Behavioral Health?

Are there opportunities for collaboration across parish lines to address Behavioral Health? (lessons learned, best practices, EMRs, etc.)



SWOT Emerging Themes: High Level Synopsis

Priority 2: Unemployment & Economic Development

Diverse industries exist in Region 1, but poor public education and social services for youth drive up unemployment.

Questions to Consider.....

Is there equal growth in new industries across Region 1? How do new opportunities for employment vary across the parishes?

How does the variance in educational quality and opportunities throughout Region 1 impact its economic development?

SWOT Emerging Themes: High Level Synopsis

Priority 3: Violence, Crime, & Intentional Injury

Promising policies and practices that may promote community safety and buy-in are being implemented, but the structural risks that citizens face on a daily basis promote a continued culture of violence

Questions to Consider.....

Law enforcement was discussed as a Strength, Opportunity and Threat. What does that mean for this priority?
